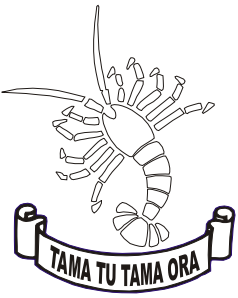
- **Maths Tutorials** – Thursday afternoons 3.00 to 4.00pm run by Bill Lonsdale, Head of Mathematics.
